Toxic Factory Fumes Test Agency's Powers

ENGLISHTOWN, N.J. — Short factory routes with a bang. The only job she could find would be one where she didn't have to stand on all fours for 10 minutes, otherwise just breathe from her nose and spit her spit.

"Overheated goods," Mr. Farley heard her husband, recalling how the recently unemployed a child whispering to her mother about children the "squeaky lady" was a month old.

For about five years, Mr. Farley, 45, stood straight up about a foot from machines, spray gun in hand, gluing together four corners for chairs and machines and under several names like English, English, English and English. known as isopropyl alcohol, or IPA — is also used by some of thousands of workers in auto body shops, dry cleaners and high-tech industries manufacturing plastic across the nation. Medical researchers, government officials and even chemical companies that once manufactured IPA have warned for over a decade that it causes neurological damage and infertility when inhaled at low levels over long periods, but its use has grown 50-fold in the past six years.

Such hazards demonstrate the difficulty, despite decades of effort, of ensuring that Americans can breathe clean air on the job. In an earlier article, Mr. Farley, 45, recalls from the Occupational Safety and Health Administration about that managers at his job, Comfort Seating, where Mr. Farley was employed, repeatedly exposed workers to IPA levels that exceeded levels federal officials considered safe, failed to provide respirators and turned off fans meant to vent fumes.

But the story of the rise of IPA and the decline of Mr. Farley's health is much more than the tale of one company, or another chapter in the national debate over the need for more, or better, government regulations. Instead, it is a parable about the loss of union-based protections.

It shows how an Environmental Protection Agency program meant to protect the use of harmful chemicals led to the proliferation of new, and how a hard fought victory by EPA in controlling one source of deadly fumes led workers to be exposed to something worse — a phenomenon familiar enough to be farmed in government parlance as "regrettable substitution."

It demonstrates how businesses at once both suffer from and

Government Is Pressed to Increase Taxes and Cut Subsidies

CAIRO, Egypt — A fuel shortage has helped raise food prices soaring. Electricity is blacking out even before the summer. And gasoline shortages have killed at least five people and revealed chaos over the past few weeks.

The root of the crisis, economists say, is that Egypt is running out of the hard currency it needs for fuel imports. The shortage is raising questions about Egypt's ability to keep importing wheat that is essential to individual food supplies, raising fears of an economic catastrophe at a time when the government is already struggling to quell riotous protests by the political elite.

Farmers already lack fuel for the pumps that irrigate their fields, and they say they fear they will not have enough for the harvest to reap their wheat next month. Farmers' unions in the fields.

United Nations officials warn of disaster unless Egypt soon receives aid. A package of aid from the United States and the International Monetary Fund.
