

JEFFREY R SARMIENTO

Jeffrey Sarmiento is Reader in Glass at the University of Sunderland. A Filipino- American artist, his work centers on constructed ethnicities, expressed through collisions of layered images within glass.

He has worked widely in the US and Europe, including fellowships at UrbanGlass New York, and a Fulbright to Denmark. He was a finalist for the 2008 Bombay Sapphire Prize and has shown in Collect at Saatchi Gallery. His work in the collection of Sunderland Museum, UK and the Speed Museum, USA. He has recently installed a monumental glass sculpture for the new Museum of Liverpool, UK.

Artist Statement

Inspired by ethnography, my artwork visualizes a search for belonging—the attempt to understand my place in the world.

"Research" takes place in cultures foreign to me. I observe, translate, and participate, and struggle to comprehend and fit in. This process forces me to evaluate and question what I know. I collect and build up layers of information to show the density of my experience. I carve it away to reveal new and complex readings. Comprised of multiple images embedded in the glass object, my work is quite literally the fusion of form and content.

As I move from place to place the work takes on the characteristic of mapping.

But the maps I make don't always point from one place to another. Instead the works show a cultural terrain. Histories are brought together, and what is foreign is transformed into the familiar. The work is my way of creating a unique connection with the local.







Estate, 2012 Screenprinted, waterjet cut and fused glass 140 x 63 x 4 cm







Hotel (white), 2012 Fused, waterjet cut and fire polished glass 46.5 x 50 x 4 cm








Hotel 2 (black), 2012 Fused, waterjet cut and fire polished glass 55 x 48 x 4 cm







Dundee, 2012 Fused, waterjet cut, fire polished and sandblasted glass $66 \times 41 \times 4 \text{ cm}$
