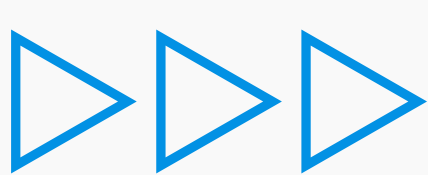
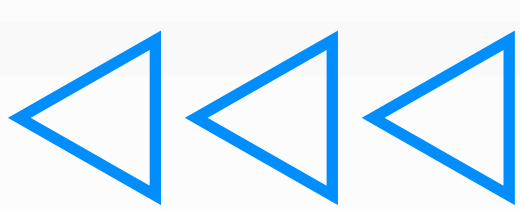
Overview of your Copenhagen tour:
